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Constitutional Amendments

Amendment A

Shall the Utah Constitution be amended to change how proposed constitutional amendments are published, requiring publication for 60 days immediately before the general election in a manner established by

state law instead of in newspapers? If voters approve Constitutional Amendment A, state statute would

change to require the Lieutenant Governor to publish the full text of all proposed constitutional amendments and other ballot questions from the Legislature, on the Utah Public Notice Website and on the Lieutenant Governor's website for 60 days immediately before the general election.

Amendment B

Shall the Utah Constitution be amended to require that citizen-proposed laws that increase taxes compared to existing law be approved by at least 60% of voters, instead of a simple majority?

Roy City Referendum

Shall the City of Roy be authorized to levy a tax rate in the amount sufficient to generate an increased property tax revenue of \$1,749,050 for fiscal year 2027 as budgeted, adopted, and approved by the City of Roy?



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
